In the medium and long term, EUNICE should become one of the transforming pillars, in Europe but with a holistic projection, of higher education, research, the labour market and the economy, and society.

All this with the participation of people trained on the basis of new principles and values, knowledge and skills, with the orientation and objective of creating fairer and more balanced societies, and enabling development that respects people, local contexts and the global environment.

OUR VALUES

EUNICE alliance will be:

- Multicentre: through the synergy of seven geographically balanced higher education institutions.
- Intercultural: it will strengthen European identity and promote common European values through interculturalism, including multilingualism, but within a global context.
- Open: it will promote a European dimension to education while strengthening a non-discriminatory and egalitarian society, through the good practices of partner universities.
- Person-centred: it will provide a framework with flexible educational pathways, within which students and educators will personalise curricula.
