

Poznan University of Technology

Poznan University of Technology (PUT) is one of the Top 5 technical universities in Poland. It is also among the Top 3 higher education institutions most frequently chosen by students in the country. PUT is a university with over 100 years of experience in educating highly qualified engineers and researchers, and it also strongly cooperates with local industry and socio-economic stakeholders.







Brandenburg University of Technology Cottbus-Senftenberg

Cottbus-Senftenberg is a technological university located in the state of Brandenburg, northeastern Germany. BTU collaborates closely with partners from business and science communities to current challenges overcome related to Energy, Materials, Information and Construction, Communication Technology, Health and Environment. University of Catania

Université Polytechnique Hauts-de-France

The Université Polytechnique Hauts-de-France (UPHF) is the very first polytechnic university in France and its teaching is based on two poles: Humanities and Science and Technology. Located in Hauts-de-France (North of France) 14% of its students come from 85 different countries.





University of Vaasa

The EUNICE AISBL is a full partner of the EUNICE Consortium. Its first President is Philippe Dubois, current Rector of UMONS.



STUDENT ADVISORY BOARD

14 student representatives (two from each affiliated university) take an active part in university life, supporting the organisation of events, informing the student community about EUNICE initiatives and providing feedback to the EUNICE Steering Committee to shape the alliance according to the students' interests.



2. Activities



Virtual Interactive Social European University



- Identification of the job centres and employment observation offices of the EUNICE regions and analysis of their competency needs;
- Benchmark and selection of the courses responding answering to the identified competency needs;
- Preparation of the courses to be offered in the shared Moodle and creation of shared templates, methodologies and management processes, allowing the recognition of learning outcomes via the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) and/or open badges;
- Co-creation of curricula for EUNICE **Excellence Programmes**, multiple degrees to be jointly offered when the European legislation is ready.


OUTCOMES

- A shared catalogue of online courses, offering students and staff the opportunity to customize their education with micro-credentials;
- A common courses management procedure, allowing the 10 EUNICE universities to align their academic administrative processes;
- A monitoring system of the competency needs in our territories, allowing a step towards a
 Community of Practice and open recognition of participation and learning outcomes via Open
 Badges;
- Innovative bachelor, master and PhD joint study programmes ready to be implemented in the next years.



































Virtual courses 2023





Shaping European Citizens



- Activities to promote European values and to increase the sense of belonging among the EUNICE communities.
- Design of a language course offer focusing both on discovering our national languages and on English language skills.
- Promotion of innovative formats such as a Massive Open Online Courses (MOOC) and Blended
 Intensive Programmes (BIP) to promote new topics and inclusiveness in the acquisition of
 global competency.
- Creation of a cultural and sport festival -Eunice Weeks- to focus on our individual and shared heritage, values and issues: concerts, guided virtual tours, conferences, culinary experiences, etc.
- Broadening of the Erasmus experience through new initiatives, developing new mobility, formats, such as the host-family scheme or collaboration with the Erasmus Student Network.
- Creation of a Eunice Certificate in Global Competencies to encourage internationalization and recognize training through EUNICE.

OUTCOMES

- 12 language courses catalogue with high enrolment and satisfaction rates (2,600 applications in the 2022-23 academic year). 2nd edition launched.
- 1st co-created MOOC ("Introduction to Global Studies"): more than 500 registrations.
- More than 30 cultural and sports events (online and hybrid).













Open Virtual System for Education, Reseach and Innovation



- Constant planning and development of IT tools to provide necessary infrastructure for sharing resources and facilitating inter-university activities.
- A crucial point for a multi-centric university that expands beyond the existing infrastructure to provide seamless and scalable cooperation and interaction between partners.
- Integrates research activities, provision of education, administrative processes and governance of EUNICE.

OUTCOMES

- Implementation of **Moodle** as a common learning platform hosting both EUNICE shared courses and EUNICE MOOC. Good results from student satisfaction surveys where students rated the **accessibility and ease of use** of the courses (4+ on a scale of 1-5.
- The Virtual Lab to explore new pedagogical methods, developed and successfully piloted in Poznań, will enhance the experience of EUNICE courses in the future.
- The **Partner Research Umbrella** enables easy access to all partners' publication databases to work towards EUNICE's long-term goal of research collaboration.
- Plan for building a common IT platform to support both education and administration in the next phase of the project.

Training, Research & Development for Industry-oriented Problems



- Design and implementation of the EUNICE International Internship Portal, targeting EUNICE students (bachelor, master, Ph.D.) to offer them training opportunities in international companies, research centers, NGOs,...
- Industrial (2021) & Industrial Ph.D. Workshops (2022): aimed at fostering linkages between academia, industry and society, reinforcing cross-sectoral and multidisciplinary international networking with the involvement of associated partners. These were the first steps in the design and implementation of dual education towards 'customised' curricula.
- EUNICE Contamination Lab & EUNICE Imagine Innovation Cup contests (2023): to promote entrepreneurial mindset and skills and valorization of new start-ups and spin-offs.
- Joint Open Lab: a database of EUNICE partner universities' equipment and facilities which have been made available to third parties, together with the regulations on how to get access – to be further implemented on a web platform.

OUTCOMES

- 226 companies offering international internships.
- Third sector input for curricula enhancement.
- 161 academics offering international research internships.

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Mobility task force & Peer-IR-View **Project**



- This task force and the Peer-IR-view project brought the 7 institutions even closer together.
- · Benchmarking of the 7 International Relations Offices (IRO) of EUNICE in the following fields: Institution overview key day, IRO organisation within the institution, international priorities and strategy, IRO operations.
- Development of knowledge management toolkits to help IROs retaining and sharing knowledge more efficiently.
- · Conception and implementation of peer-assisted methodologies among the consortium;
- · Dissemination of the methodologies and toolkits among other European universities and International Relations Offices around the world.
- Support EUNICE in the development of international mobility and towards an alignment of administrative processes.

Academic and wider competence development offerings

- To clearly identify key competencies that EUNICE activities will endeavour to promote, which are in line with the EUNICE mission statement.
- To increase the alignment of academic and administrative processes across EUNICE universities, to facilitate the expansion of shared academic offerings across the EUNICE network at all levels, including lifelong learners.
- To expand the shared academic offer available at EUNICE, ensuring the integration of new partners and the development of new opportunities, so as to promote the vision and values articulated in the EUNICE mission statement and the EUNICE key competencies.
- To support foreign language instruction as a key component of the inter-cultural awareness and shared values within EUNICE.
- To develop and foster pedagogical excellence and innovation across EUNICE universities.
- Encourage students to **get involved** in European politics at local, national and European level and increase their participation in European democratic processes.



Experiential learning and mobility

- To strengthen student **leadership** within EUNICE and at EUNICE universities.
- To empower students to develop EUNICE key competencies through experiential learning.
- To promote activities which advance European values through the EUNICE values, enable **cultural expression** and inspire inter-cultural exchange.
- To facilitate mobility experiences that are aligned with and contribute to the promotion of EUNICE values.
- To facilitate **exchanges of practices and learning** between employees at EUNICE universities in areas of focus for the Alliance.



Research-driven bridges between universities, business & society

- To promote international networking for the direct application of knowledge generated at EUNICE universities to contribute to social, economic, environmental, and cultural development.
- To promote EUNICE key competencies related to **employability** and European citizenship through experiential learning activities.
- To **engage students** in transnational research activities and thereby close the gap between education and research in an international landscape.
- To encourage and support the development of new enterprises to innovate and grow internationally, thus generating useful goods and services and broader entrepreneurial skills and values, in a transition to more sustainable business models.
- To support multilateral cooperation projects in the landscape of the Horizon Europe framework and future programmes. This also includes also multinational research projects that connect basic research to partners at high technology readiness levels, thus leading to future European innovations.

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
