3. COURSE CONTENT.

The course will deal with the activities of the United Nations. In particular it will emphasize the respective roles of the UN General Assembly and of the Security Council.

4. LEARNING OUTCOMES.

The course aims to provide students with an initial knowledge of the way in which the United Nations works, the main activities of its principal political organs and the resolutions they adopt. The course also aims to enhance:

Knowledge and understanding.

Critical understanding of the way the main political organs in the UN system (the General Assembly and the Security Council) operate.

Applying knowledge and understanding

Ability to identify the essential elements of a problem and address it in terms of balanced and mutually acceptable solutions.

Ability to use analogy as a tool to apply known solutions to new problems (problem solving).

Ability to draft and negotiate legal/political texts.

Making judgements

Ability to convey own interpretations of UN resolutions and discussing them with others.

Communication skills.

Ability to discuss about UN resolutions.

Learning skills.

Ability to understand, draft and negotiate UN texts.

5. OBJECTIVES.

The course aims at providing the following objectives:

- to apply fundamental notions of UN law (the Charter and the Rules of procedure);
- to apply fundamental notions of International Organization law;

- to apply the acquired skills for drafting UN resolutions and for negotiating them.
