3. COURSE CONTENT.

- 1-During this course the student will learn the very basic words and phrases of Spanish in different everyday situations:
 - greetings
 - numbers telling the time, prices
 - most common phrases connected to studying: library, lectures, exercises, seminars, official functions, socializing, life on campus
 - everyday practical situations: shopping, food, going to a café/restaurant/bar, buying a train ticket, concert ticket, movie ticket online
- 2-They will also get information about Spanish culture and society:
 - How do we talk to people (formal vs. informal)?
 - National idiosyncracies
- 3-Basic information about the University of Cantabria and possibilities to deepen the language skills while in Spain.

4. LEARNING OUTCOMES.

The student will learn how Spanish works as a language, how to understand simple texts and find information in them. The student will also get practice in listening comprehension and learn how to correctly pronounce Spanish. Moreover, they will learn about the very basics about Spanish society and culture.

Practice of receptive skills and strategies needed to manage everyday situations in Spanish and motivation of students to deepen their skills in Spanish. To convey an understanding of culturally significant factors.
