



Regulations

1. Contest organizer

The organizers of the **Polibuda Chess Cup** are:

- Student Council of the Faculty of Civil and Transport Engineering
- Sports Center of Poznan University of Technology
- Academic Sports Association of Poznan University of Technology

2. Purpose of the tournament

The purpose of the chess tournament is to unite the EUNICE European University community and promote sportsmanship in a competitive spirit by showcasing participants' chess-playing skills. The final day will determine the winner of the tournament held as part of the European University EUNICE competition.

3. Date and venue

The tournament will take place on **May 18, 2025**, starting at 1:00 PM CET. All games will be played online via the Lichess platform and streamed on the social media channels of the Student Council of the Faculty of Civil and Transport Engineering.

4. Tournament format and time control

- The tournament will consist of 11 rounds played in the Swiss system.
- Time control: 3 minutes + 2 seconds increment per move for each player.
- Final standings will be determined based on total points. In the case of a tie, the following tiebreakers will apply in order: total points, Buchholz Cut 1, Buchholz, Sonneborn-Berger, progressive score, head-to-head result, number of wins.

5. Participation condition

- All employees and students currently working or studying at universities being a part of the EUNICE European University are eligible to participate.
- The selection of ten participants will be made within the European University Office of Poznan University of Technology. We work on a first-come, first-served basis, which means that applications will be processed in the order in which they are





received.

- Once you have been accepted to the tournament, you will need to create an account on the Lichess platform.
- Confirmation of a player's participation in the tournament will be sent by e-mail after the application deadline, i.e. 12th May 2025.
- Participation in the tournament implies the player's consent to the processing of their personal data (including collection, processing, and transfer), as well as entering this data into IT systems necessary for the later identification of participants, as part of task implementation (in accordance with Article 23, section 1, point 1 of the Personal Data Protection Act of August 29, 1997, Journal of Laws of 2002 No. 101, item 926, as amended).

6. Registration

- To take part in the tournament, participants must complete the registration form correctly.
- Entrants must use their university email address when registering. Applications from private email addresses will not be considered.

7. Prizes

The organizer has planned prizes for the top three ranked participants in the tournament (top three winning spots in the contest).

8. Final provisions

The organizers reserve the right to the final interpretation of these rules. Participants using chess engines or other forms of assistance will be disqualified from the tournament.

9. Additional information

The event will be livestreamed with commentary, which can be followed on the Facebook fan page of the Student Council of the Faculty of Civil and Transport Engineering. The livestream will be held in English.
