

Call for Participation: EUNICE Student Research Club - Bottom-Up Approach

Are you a Bachelor's, Master's and PhD student? Are you interested in working in an international research team on your research idea? Is your research idea related to one of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals, Green and Digital transition or maybe focused on Women in STEM subjects? Are you seeking students who share your passion and specialise in the same research field? Then apply [here](#) and convert your research idea into a research project by creating your own International Student Research Club!

The call for the research club bottom-up approach is open to applicants from any field of study.

How does it work?

Step 1: Apply

- Apply [here](#) **until the 26th of March 2026**.
- By filling in the survey you indicate which societal problem your research idea or research project is most related to. Following your selection, the contact details of other applicants in your indicted field of interest will be shared with you.

Step 2: Find club members and create a SRC

- Get in touch with other applicants based on your survey results and create a Student Research Club with suitable members for your research idea.
- Check [here](#) the requirements for the research club composition.
- Once you have created your club and decided on the research project, you must complete the [Information Sheet](#) for your club and upload it in Moodle. The link to the Moodle portal will be shared with you in the course of the activity.
- **Deadline for the submission of the Information Sheet is the 24nd of April 2026.**
- Only research clubs that have registered using the information sheet can continue to participate.

Step 3: Develop Your Research Proposal

- Following the submission of the completed Information Sheet, each research club works on their research project. Check [here](#) further details for the research club collaboration.
- **By the 28th of May 2026** each research club is required to present its proposal for the research project and estimated costs to the EUNICE jury. Check the eligible costs for planning your budget [here](#).
- Selection of Winning Club at the **start of June**: The EUNICE Jury will evaluate and decide on the winning research club based on the [evaluation criteria](#).
- The winning club will have time until the end of August 2026 to carry out their research project.
- **Note that the available funding will only be granted to the winning research club.**
